

- Tracking for a good surplus
 - Total cash reserves were at about ~\$145,000.000.
 - We plan to spend/ have began to spend ~\$177,447 this year.
 - Given a revenue of close to ~\$196,000 we will make approximately ~18,000 this year
 - In respect of budget, this has been kept almost identical to 2023.
 - ○ The thought process behind this is two-fold:
 - As sure will/has been talked about, we increased our sponsorship cost. So initially, I was operating on an increased overall budget.
 - In reality, what we have seen (aside from a few external sponsors) is an aversion to spend. Accordingly, most of our original sponsorship budgets are adequate.
 - Law ball is budgeted to make approximately ~\$50,000 this year. This is a reflection of the popularity of the event although represents an increase when compared to last year.
 - This will be important and to ensure we hit this, we will need careful oversight during organisation although this is not something I am worried about as our events portfolio has been financially prudent thus far.
- Admin - merch
 - 6000 allocated to spend so okay if we don't make a surplus on it
- ALSA
 - This has remained the same with a slight increase in what we are giving competitors.
 - This reflects practice in the previous year and hopefully will result in a budget more reflective of actual practice this year
- Careers
 - Overall budget remains the same. Not much to report.
 - Clerkship night budget was increased (although probably over-estimate based on what we have paid so far) so no stress here.
- Some increase in spending for law ball

- Competitions, need to talk with the College of Law re increasing their contribution perhaps
- Taking loss on law camp worth it for overall engagement and quality of experience
- Peppercorn - querying whether they need more money, otherwise budget remaining the same
- SJ - slight overall reduction in budget since more going to Equity - in reflecting new directorships

- No fraud or embezzlement, affirmed by our auditor and accountant
- Surplus last year was approx 18.5k; normal for society
- Operating largely the same way in the same environment
- Sponsorships our largest source of income
 - Tickets and merch sales second biggest
 - Then faculty grants
- 2023 great increase in sponsorships income, which offset law ball losses
- Law ball our main expense
 - Very normal cf previous years
- Assets
 - All money in bank or with the ATO
 - Maybe we could invest in high interest account to maximise for future contingency planning
- Cash flow mainly from events and existence as a society, reflects other figures
- Auditor
 - Said everything is going well, nothing of concern
 - Need to come up with a better way of tracking who has cards etc at what time
 - Will come up with constitutional descriptions of where we could spend / lose money
 - Not something of major concern and common in student societies

General Merchandising and Market Day

- Lessons for next time: focus on more substantial wearables which enable more understandable pricing
- Market Day ran well and only one unfulfilled jersey order to follow up

Meetings

- Have been running smoothly, good attendance from the Committee and a generally strong commitment to sending apologies

Publicity

- Actioning promotion requests sent from internal ANU groups (AYBIL, JOLT) and LSS portfolios
- Some issues with requests for advertising with 1-2 days' notice but generally very strong uptake on request form
- Trialled 'Weekly Wellbeing' at the beginning of the semester - may continue but less often to ameliorate Directors' workload
- Utilising TikTok to make more student-centric content that provides a glimpse into student life and activities
- Getting good engagement despite early days and will attempt to create more content using snippets from Clerkship Evening etc.
